



New Year 2022 Update

The [World Migration Report 2022](#), recently published by the United Nations, estimates that there are now 281 million international migrants globally (or 3.6% of the world's population). While the vast majority of people in the world continue to live in the country in which they were born, more people are migrating to other countries, especially those within their region. COVID-19 has caused significant disruption and global displacement is currently at a record high, with the number of internally displaced at around 55 million and the number of refugees at over 26 million.

In the face of a huge global refugee tragedy, Louth Churches for Refugees represents a practical response providing direct support at a local level. We continue to support a resettled refugee family in Louth within the government's Community Sponsorship programme. In one of our recent meetings with the family we spent time reviewing support which has been in place since their arrival in Louth and the way in which those arrangements will evolve into the future. We continue to be encouraged by the family's resilience in settling in and in the children's educational achievements which are so positive to see.

We're currently progressing with plans to welcome a second resettled family to Louth and we are hoping to have secured a suitable property soon. In anticipation of the second family's needs, we are continuing to seek donated household furnishings. Please get in touch if you are able to help and to discuss transport/storage of any items you are able to offer.

We are very grateful for all financial donations towards our work and we're delighted to welcome several new regular donors who are joining those who contribute monthly by standing order.
